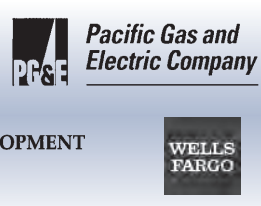

# EL DORADO COUNTY CHAMBER SAYS:

## MEASURES M, N, AND O ARE EXTREME AND UNNECESSARY

The El Dorado County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors strongly oppose Measures M, N, and O that have been placed on this November's ballot.

These extreme and unnecessary measures are bad for business, will decimate local jobs, and damage our local economy. In addition, they erode property-owners rights and will strip our county of local control over responsible planning and economic growth.

Here's why you should vote no:

**Measure M**  
Strips El Dorado County of local control and eliminates voter-approved safeguards controlling growth, limiting traffic, and protecting open space. It reduces private property rights, hurts our economy

and will cost El Dorado County hundreds of millions in tax revenue — important for public services.

**Measure N**  
Undercuts the voter-approved El Dorado County General Plan — jeopardizing the amount of developer fees for road and infrastructure improvements. It will paralyze El Dorado County for years with costly legal battles over land use issues.

**Measure O**  
Is unnecessary, deeply flawed, and will upset the careful land use balance achieved with the voter-approved El Dorado County General Plan. It is another radical proposal claiming to reduce traffic and preserve open space, but instead will produce more congestion and growth in rural areas of El
